Course Description

This course is an overview of the major aspects of English word structure. We will look at the meaningful elements of English words and study how they combine to derive a great part of the vocabulary of English. We will also look at the development of the English vocabulary and sources of new words, articulation of sounds, sound and meaning change, as well as the origin of English and related languages. The course will emphasize practical skills of linguistic analysis, with part of each class devoted to data analysis. At the end of the course you will be able to analyze morphologically complex words, have a firm grasp of basic patterns of English word formation, acquire a basic understanding of the history of English, enrich your vocabulary by mastering a core set of Greek and Latin roots that occur frequently in English words, and acquire skill interpreting the etymological information provided by dictionaries. The course grade will be calculated as follows:
